# LEAGUE RULES

## 1. MATCH FIXTURES

a) Each match will be played on a Monday night; cancelled or postponed matches may be played on a different day at the discretion of the Management Committee.

b) Matches shall be played according to the fixture list distributed.

## 2. MATCH RULES

a) All matches shall commence by 7:00pm.

b) All rubbers shall be played in the order, as shown on the scorecard.

c) A maximum of 2 minutes knock-up will be allowed before each rubber.

d) The order of play shall be A v Y, B v X, A v X, B v Y, doubles

e) Teams may introduce a third player into the match to play the doubles only.

f) A match will consist of five rubbers, for which a total of 3 points shall be available. Points to be awarded as follows:-

A team winning 5-0 shall receive 5 points

A team winning 4-1 shall receive 4 points

A team winning 3-2 shall receive 3 points

A team losing 2-3 shall receive 2 points

A team losing 1-4 shall receive 1 point

A team losing 0-5 shall receive no point

g) Matches will be played in accordance with Table Tennis England Rules

## 3. EQUIPMENT

### a) The Match Ball

i) The ball shall be spherical, with a diameter of 40mm.

ii) The ball shall weigh 2.7gm.

iii) The ball shall be matt and made of plastic material and shall be white or orange.

iv) All match balls shall be 3 star and TTE approved.

### b) Clothing

i). The main colour of a shirt, skirt or shorts, other than sleeves and collar of a shirt shall be clearly different from that of the ball in use.

ii) Suitable trainers, or other sports shoes, shall be worn during play.

### c) The Racket ~

i) All registered players shall play with a racket, where one playing surface is bright red and the other is black.

ii) The racket may be of any size, shape or weight but the blade shall be flat and rigid.

iii) At least 85% of the blade by thickness shall be of natural wood; an adhesive layer within the blade may be reinforced with fibrous material such as carbon fibre, glass fibre or compressed paper, but shall not be thicker than 7.5% of the total thickness or 0.35mm, whichever is the smaller.

iv) A side of the blade used for striking the ball shall be covered with either ordinary pimples rubber, with pimples outwards having a total thickness including adhesive of not more than 2mm, or sandwich rubber, with pimples inwards or outwards, having a total thickness including adhesive of not more than 4mm.

v) Ordinary pimples rubber is a single layer of non-cellular rubber, natural or synthetic, with pimples evenly distributed over its surface at a density of not less than 10 per sq cm and not more than 30 per sq cm.

vi) Sandwich rubber is a single layer of cellular rubber covered with a single outer layer of ordinary pimples rubber, the thickness of the pimples rubber not being more than 2mm.

vii) The covering material shall extend up to, but not beyond the limits of the blade, except that the part nearest the handle and gripped by the fingers, may be left uncovered, or covered with any material.

viii) Any layer within the blade and any layer of covering material, or adhesive, shall be continuous and of even thickness.

ix) The surface of the covering material on a side of the blade, or of a side of the blade if it is left uncovered, shall be matt, bright red on one side and black on the other.

x) Slight deviations from continuity of surface, or uniformity of colour due to accidental damage, or wear may be allowed, provided that they do not significantly change the characteristics of the surface.

xi) At the start of a match and whenever he changes his racket during a match, a player shall allow his

opponent and the umpire, to inspect the racket he is about to use

## 4. RESULTS

a) At the end of the match the team captain of each team should sign the scorecard and the captain of the first-named team shall ensure that the completed scorecard is given to the Club Secretary or other responsible person.

## 5. TEAM AND PLAYER ELIGIBILITY, REGISTRATIONS AND TRANSFERS

a) Each team in a match shall consist of a minimum of two and a maximum of three TTE and Blitz TTC registered players.

b) A player shall only be eligible to play, if they have paid all their fees owing to Blitz TTC

c) Players may not represent any other team in the same or lower division; only the team for which they are registered

d) A player wishing to transfer to any other team, in any division, must first of all seek the approval of the Blitz TTC Management Committee

e) A team playing an unregistered player, or ineligible player, shall forfeit all that player's rubbers, where he's in default.

i) All team captains must be able to be contacted either at home or work, by telephone or mobile.

## TEAM HANDICAP RULES

### 1. MATCH FIXTURES

a) Matches in the Team Handicap Competition shall be played in designated weeks within the league fixture programme.

### 2. MATCH RULES

a) All matches shall commence by 7:00pm.

b) Each team will field two players and each will play the two players of the opposing team in singles only

c) Each rubber will consist of three games, and all three games are to be played

d) Each game is to be played with the first player to reach 21 points winning, even though the score may have reached 20-20

e) Players will have two serves each, alternating

f) The order of serving, receiving or ends shall be decided by lot at the beginning of each rubber.

g) A maximum of 2 minutes knock-up will be allowed before each rubber.

h) One of the teams in a match may be awarded a points handicap by the Management Committee and this handicap will be in a sealed envelope handed to the team captains prior to the match; this envelope can only be opened at the conclusion of the match

i) All the points won by each team will be added, with one of the teams also adding their handicap points allocation for that match. The team with the most points wins the match.

j) The League Rules, with the exception of Rule 2, apply to the Team Handicap Competition.

## TEAM KNOCKOUT RULES

### 1. MATCH FIXTURES

a) Matches in the Team Knockout Competition shall be played in designated weeks within the league fixture programme.

### 2. MATCH RULES

a) The League Rules, with the exception of Rule 2f, apply to the Team Knockout Competition.

## LEAGUE FORMAT 2017/18

### 1. LEAGUE FORMAT

- a) The League will consist of 2 Divisions of teams with each division consisting of 7 teams.
- b) The teams within each Division at the start of the year has been determined by where each team finished in the 2016/17 season.
- c) The season will start Monday 11th September 2017 and finish last week in March 2018
- d) There will be 3 round of matches where everyone will play everyone within their respective division.
- e) The first 2 complete rounds of matches, will have promotion and relegation between the two divisions with the top two teams from division 2 going up and the bottom 2 teams from division 1 going down.
- f) After round 1 of matches, you will be given some bonus finishing position points. These will be as follows: If you finish in 1st in Division 1, you will receive 14 points  
If you finish 2nd in Division 1, you will receive 13 points  
3rd = 12 points, 4th = 11 points, 5th = 10 points, 6th = 9 points, 7th = 8 points.  
If you finish in 1st in Division 2, you will receive 7 points,  
2nd = 6 points, 3rd = 5 points, 4th = 4 points, 5th = 3 points, 6th = 2 points and 7th = 1 point.
- g) You will then start Round 2 of matches, within the appropriate division after promotion and relegation, on these bonus finishing position points. The usual points for a 5-0 win etc for each match win will then be added onto these bonus finishing position points as normal.
- h) At the end of Round 2, teams will once again be given bonus points for their finishing position within their division, as shown above.
- i) Teams will then add their bonus finishing position points from Round 1, to their bonus finishing position points from Round 2. The total of these bonus points will determine which Division your team, will be in for the final round (Round 3).
- j) If two teams are tied, then the total games won across the course of the 2 rounds of matches will determine where each team is ranked. The top 7 ranked teams will be in Division 1, the next 7 ranked teams will be in Division 2 for the remainder of the season.
- k) Each team will then start Round 3 of matches on their total bonus finishing position points across the two rounds. For example, if Team A finishes both round 1 and round 2 in 1st place in Division 1, they will start Round 3 on 28 bonus points.
- l) The usual points for a 5-0 win etc will then be added onto these bonus points as normal.
- m) The winner of each division will be the team with the most points at the end of round 3.
- n) In short, in round 1 & 2, each team is playing for positions in the league to gain bonus points. These bonus points will determine which division you will start the 3rd and final round in, and you will also start Round 3 on those bonus points. Each team will continue to accumulate points as normal for a 5-0 win etc, and these points will be added on top of your bonus points.

# CLUB CONSTITUTION

## 1. NAME

The club will be called Blitz Table Tennis Club and will be affiliated to the English Table Tennis Association.

## 2. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aims and objectives of the club will be:

- A) To offer coaching and competitive opportunities in Table Tennis
- B) To promote the club within the local community and Table Tennis
- C) To ensure a duty of care to all members of the club
- D) To provide all its services in a way that is fair to everyone

## 3. MEMBERSHIP

To ensure all present and future members receive fair and equal treatment. Membership should consist of officers and members of the club. All members will be subject to the regulations of the constitution and code of practice and by joining the club will be deemed to accept these regulations and codes of practice that the club has adopted.

Members will be enrolled in one of the following categories:

- A) Adult Playing Member (Over 18)
- B) Associate Member
- C) Junior Playing Member (Any member eligible to play in junior competitions according to the ETTA rules)

## 4. MEMBERSHIP FEES

Membership fees will be set annually and agreed by the Management Committee to be approved at the Annual General Meeting.

Fees will be paid annually on or before 1st September each year. League, match and coaching fees to be paid as and when appropriate. All unpaid fees will be carried forward to the following year.

## 5. OFFICERS OF THE CLUB

The officers of the club will be:

- A) Chair, B) Vice Chair, C) Secretary, D) Treasurer, E) Welfare Officer
- F) Ordinary Committee Member.

Officers will be elected annually at the Annual General Meeting

All officers will retire each year but will be eligible for re-appointment.

## 6. COMMITTEE.

The Club will be managed through the Management Committee consisting of:

Chair; Secretary; Treasurer; Welfare officer; Ordinary Committee member(s).

The Management Committee meetings will be convened by the club Secretary and held no less than once per calendar month.

The quorum required for business to be agreed at Management Committee meetings will be three

The Management Committee will be responsible for adopting new policy, codes of practice and rules that affect the organisation of the club.

The Management Committee will have powers to appoint sub-committees as necessary, and appoint advisers to the Management Committee as necessary to fulfil its business.

The Management Committee will be responsible for disciplinary hearings of members who infringe the club rules/regulations/constitution. The Management Committee will be responsible for taking any action of suspension or discipline following such hearings.

## 7. FINANCE

All monies will be banked in an account held in the club's name

The Club Treasurer will be responsible for the finances of the club.

The financial year of the club will end on 5th April each year.

An audited statement of annual accounts will be presented by the Treasurer at the Annual General Meeting.

Any cheques drawn against club funds should hold the signatures of the Treasurer plus either the Chair or Secretary.

## 8. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

Notice of Annual General Meetings (AGM) will be given by the Club Secretary, with no less than 21 clear days notice to be given to all members.

The AGM will receive a report from the officers of the Management Committee and a statement of audited accounts.

Nominations for officers of the Management Committee will be sent to the Secretary no later than 14 days prior to the AGM.

All members have a right to vote at the AGM.

The quorum for AGMs will be 25% of the current membership.

The Management Committee has the right to call Extraordinary General Meetings (EGMs) outside the AGM. Procedure for EGMs will be the same as for AGM.

## 9. DISCIPLINE AND APPEALS.

All concerns, allegations or reports of poor practice/abuse relating to the welfare of children and young people will be recorded and responded to swiftly and appropriately in accordance with the club's child protection policy and procedures. The club Welfare Officer is the lead contact for all members in the event of any child protection concerns.

All complaints regarding the behaviour of members should be presented and submitted in writing to the Secretary.

The Management Committee will meet to hear complaints within seven days of a complaint being lodged. The committee has the power to take appropriate disciplinary action including the termination of membership.

The outcome of a disciplinary hearing should be notified in writing to the person who lodged the complaint and the member against whom the complaint was made within seven days of the hearing.

There will be a right of appeal to the Management Committee following disciplinary action being announced. The Committee should consider the appeal within seven days of the Secretary receiving the appeal.

## 10. DISSOLUTION.

A resolution to dissolve the club can only be passed at an AGM or EGM through a majority vote of the membership.

In the event of dissolution, any assets of the club that remain will become the property of the English Table Tennis Association or the Gainsborough and District Table Tennis League.

## 11. AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

The constitution will only be changed through agreement by majority vote at an AGM or EGM

## 12. DECLARATION.

Blitz Table Tennis Club hereby adopts and accepts this constitution as a current operating guide regulating the actions of members.
